<b>SEMESTER THREE COMPULSORY COURSES</b>	
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>ELE 331: PRACTICUM</b> (not cross-listed with MA TESL)</p> <p>The course is designed to help young pre-service teachers learn from teaching, observation and reflection, and thereby develop an understanding of the principles of language teaching. The students will be able to apply their knowledge of theories of Second Language learning and approaches to Second Language teaching from other MA courses and integrate them into their teaching in a classroom context. The practicum experience will thus serve to integrate programme content within authentic teaching and learning environment.</p>	<p>Prof. MeeraSrinivas &amp; Dr. MahanandaPathak</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>ELE 253: An Introduction to ESL Research</b> (cross-listed with MA TESL, only IIIrd semester)</p> <p>This course will provide an opportunity for participants to advance their understanding of conducting research in ESL by looking at purposes and types of research, research variables, research questions and hypotheses, and the methodological details of quantitative and qualitative methods of research. The course will also help the participants to critically review literature relevant to the domain of English Language Teaching and various topics in it such as language development, cognitive, socio-cognitive paradigms, and communicative and affective factors that influence the developmental process of SL/FL learning.</p>	<p>Prof. Lina Mukhopadhyay</p>
