I SEMESTER – BA (H/R) JAPAENESE

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

JPN 101: Reading and Writing - 1:

By the end of this course, the student can understand familiar names, words and very simple sentences, for example on notices and posters or in catalogues. Further, s/he will be able to use simple phrases and sentences to describe where one lives and people one knows.

JPN 102: Listening and Speaking 1:

By the end of this course, the student can recognise familiar words and very basic phrases concerning oneself, one's family and immediate concrete surroundings when people speak slowly and clearly. S/he can interact in a simple way provided the other person is prepared to repeat or rephrase things at a slower rate of speech and helps formulate what one is trying to say. S/he will be able to ask and answer simple questions in areas of immediate need or on very familiar topics.

JPN 10 3: Basic Grammar & Kanji:

The student will be able to comprehend basic sentence patterns. (Minna No Nihongo Lesson 1-25). Further, the student will be able to read and write 100 Kanjis.

SEC 101: History of Japan 1 (Pre-Historic-Bkumatsu):

This course offers an overview of the history of Japan from the prehistoric period to the beginning to the end of the Edo period. At the end of the semester, a student should be familiar with the main historical events and developments from the primitive period to the beginning of the early modern period and the relevant keywords in Japanese.
